

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

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ABSTRACT

The visual creative art paper "Motherhood" is inspired by the ancient Chinese saying: "Women are weak, mothers are strong." This study aims to explore the physical changes in women's thoughts, roles and responsibilities after giving birth to children in today's society. The conceptual creation scope of this study is the psychological changes that accompany motherhood. The creative forms include visual art creation and the use of mixed media, and the techniques include paper cutting, printmaking, bamboo weaving and other materials. Creation is based on data collected from environmental conditions, data from relevant literature, and data from influential visual art creations. The data was analyzed to find clarity of themes, symbolic forms and creative techniques, resulting in a total of eight unique artworks.

Nurturing is expressed through the results of the mother's body language, symbolically conveyed through bamboo weaving techniques, blessings and teachings written on paper. The bonds of love are intertwined and expressed through rhythmic lines and volumes. The outer shape conveys a protective nature, while the inner structure embodies the image of warmth and a safe embrace. It is a visual representation of the mother's imagination.

The importance of mothers' use of body language in parenting, paying particular attention to the role of emotional connection through hugs and mother-child interactions. The loving connection is created through a rhythmic combination of lines and volumes, which highlights the mother's creativity in visual expression and provides a new perspective on understanding emotional communication in the parent-child relationship.





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
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CHAPTER I

The majority of the pieces are in motion, which offers viewers a range of visual experiences and produces dynamic and rhythmic visual effects. It illustrates the relationship between the female body and family, independence, and procreation. The paper-cut bun doll, however, honors the principles of traditional culture and the transmission of feminine roles.


Conceptual of Frame Work

I was introduced to the idea of expressing warmth through one's own experiences and recollections by the artist Yin Xiuzhen. She makes art using personal items, such as worn-out clothing, shoes, furniture, and images, that are connected to women's memories and wishes. She produced several pieces that I still think about fondly. I also learned how to combine rice paper and bamboo weaving to make unique installation forms, and I embellished the surface with Chinese paper cuts to convey my emotions about becoming a mother.

Idea, concept: The employment of lighting in a proper setting improves the work's visual effects. Lighting is positioned at various viewing angles and heights to

provide dynamic and rhythmic visual effects. Discover the special parental qualities of women using bamboo weaving and the distinctive Chinese folk paper-cut culture. Bun dolls, a paper-cutting motif from Chinese folk art, are used to represent the wealth and happiness of the family. We combine these two ideas to reflect the distinct beauty of women's bodies while also examining the obligations and tasks of contemporary women in both traditional and modern society.

Method: The piece employs a bamboo weaving and rice paper installation method. The work's dynamic and layered visual effect, which depicts the adoration and reverence of life, is achieved by using visually striking colors and the overlapping paper-cutting of bun dolls. It is a kind of embodiment of tolerance and love.



Definition of Terms

1. Bun doll: Bun doll is a traditional Chinese paper-cutting. One of the most traditional, oversized, straightforward, and joyous pictures in Chinese folk paper-cut art. The doll is posed frontally with a round head, wide shoulders, rising or drooping arms, wide legs, and turned-out hands and feet. Bun doll: a representation of luck and happiness and the deity of life and reproduction.
2. Chinese rice paper: The technique of making rice paper is uniquely Chinese. Rice paper is long-lasting, resistant to aging, and not readily discolored. It also has great ink-wetting properties. Rice paper is strong but moisturizing, smooth but not slippery, white and thick, has a pure texture, and stays intact when folded and refolded. It also has remarkable penetrating and lubricating capabilities.
3. Installations: Installation art can be divided into three major parts. The first is the installation art itself, and the second is a space that accommodates the installation, which can be outdoor or indoor. If the work is presented in an outdoor environment or space, it will also be classified as "public art" (public art) and "land art" (land art); finally, people. The people here can be the artist himself, or the artist has created a completed installation space for people to experience and interpret, or they can be people who come to visit. The visitors become part of the installation art, and the visitor's action completes the formation of this installation art.
4. Mixed-media: Mixed materials are used to express works of art, and paper-cutting and lighting are integrated. Light not only meets people's physiological needs for perceiving the shape of objects and the color of space, but is also the material condition to set off the atmosphere of the space, strengthen the connotation of the space, and create the artistic conception of the space. Using warm-colored lighting to enhance the atmosphere of installation works can give the space a different visual experience, thereby achieving the purpose of expressing the personality of the space and enhancing the recognition of the work.




Figure 3 bamboo

Therefore, women will face more serious problems such as increased pressure to have children, declining labor participation rates, employment discrimination, and obstacles in returning to the workplace after giving birth.




Figure 8 Writing greetings with Chinese ink

Theory

The creation of works of art involves studying related theories to support ideas and objectives. Conveying meaning in creative works in this work, I studied the expression of mixed media techniques. Aesthetic meanings in the visual arts and the visual elements of art are as follows.

Art in New Media (2009) In the mid-1980s, China experienced a shift in artistic expression in new media such as installation, video, and performance.

Exposure to Western art, philosophy, and culture led many to experiment with new forms of expression. through installation, video, and performance art. This is considered a change from traditional Chinese painting and sculpture.

Installation Art (Rodboon, 2023) The novel environment created by the installation triggers the audience's memory and generates experience in the form of memory. The experience is further enhanced by the audience's interpretation. It is an art form that expresses concepts and ideas in a holistic and spatial manner. It creates a visual and sensory experience with unique meaning and value through the organic combination of three-dimensional composition, physical combination, sound, light, and other elements.

The core of installation art is to create by combining and using factors such as materials, environment, time, space, and so on. It emphasizes the participation and interaction of the audience. Unlike traditional static artwork, it requires the audience to actively experience and feel the work on site. At the same time, installation art usually tends to reflect on social reality, human survival, and other themes and can challenge, guide, or inspire the audience.

Art Elements

(Chalood Nimsamer, 2014) Visual elements are the aesthetics that artists use to assemble into shapes to convey meaning according to a story or idea. They consist of points that are the smallest parts without width, length, or depth. Lines are the most important basic visual element. Lines have a sense of their own. Lines are formed from points that connect together in length. The characteristic of a line is one-dimensional; that is, its length has the characteristic of direction and size. Various characteristics of lines include straight lines, curves, crooked lines, etc. The direction of the line is horizontal, deep, and vertical. Size of lines do not have width but are thick, thin, large, or small and can be shaped into any shape or form. The feeling created by straight lines gives a feeling of strength and stability. The curves give a feeling of comfort, the flow is harmonious, the slow movement expresses softness, and the narrow curve that changes direction quickly gives the impression of intense movement. Circular lines and spiral curves give the feeling of movement, unravelling and growing into the power of the infinite power of movement found in nature, for example.

(Qingqing, 2020) The art technique of paper-cutting is related to the integration of objects into emotions, artistic conception, and interest. Through the

technique of paper-cutting, objects are conveyed artistic conception and emotional expression, and all the ideals and wishes of the people in real life are entrusted to them.

Aesthetics

The meaning of aesthetics, the theory of beauty, and the understanding of beauty are beneficial to the development and evaluation of beauty in creative works. (Thathaiya, 2004) Nature and the environment create aesthetics for humans, causing appreciation from the perception of aesthetics that arises from various impressions or emotional feelings, which is the cause of humans creating works of art and expressing themselves through their work by processing their thoughts and intellect. or perseverance and instinctive aesthetic experiences such as belief, faith, joy, sorrow, liking, etc.

(Xigongyiminshuguan, 2022) The expression of installation art in comprehensive modeling is further clarified, and the documentary and symbolic nature of objects is further clarified as humanistic thoughts and cultural characteristics in comprehensive modeling. The selection and utilization of objects in comprehensive modeling pay more attention to humanistic thoughts and the implications and possibilities of cultural characteristics. In the utilization and transformation of objects, more attention is paid to the exploration of humanistic thoughts and cultural characteristics of objects. In the exploration of humanistic thoughts and cultural characteristics, concern for people and society is reflected. The excavated objects contain human emotions, living conditions, ideological confusion, attitudes towards the world, cultural accumulation, and formal intuition factors to express and speak. Of course, this is completely different from the simple accumulation of symbols.

In Conclude Art creation requires theoretical support, and I delved into mixed media techniques to convey deep meaning in visual art. China's new media art emerged in the 1980s, with forms such as installation art subverting traditional concepts. The installation works create distinctive experiences, emphasizing the unity of material, environment, and time, stimulating the audience's thinking and participation. The combination of visual elements, such as lines and shapes, carries aesthetic and emotional expressions. Aesthetic theory is crucial to the creation and evaluation of works, and beauty comes from the blending of nature and the

environment. Installation art interprets humanistic thoughts and cultural characteristics through its unique form of expression.

Influence from Visual Arts

Yin Xiu Zhen installation art works display multiple meanings. On the one hand, she purified the feminine ideographic mode and gave it a broader connotation. On the other hand, she transforms the conflict caused by the collision of external forms into a relatively peaceful internal contest.(Hua, 2021) Based on creative materials such as clothing, cement, porcelain, and old furniture, she splices and reshapes her past experiences with her current ones. In this way, Yin Xiuzhen internally transforms and modifies the female ideographic model, presenting a unique art form. Her works not only show her concern for female topics but also make the audience think and resonate. In a highly developed and urbanized context, ordinary things are easily overlooked. In the process of trying to convey the state of individual life under global changes, she integrates "memory" and "experience". Using "forgotten memory" as a critical tool to examine the politics, society, and environment around it.






Figure 10 Artist: Yin Xiu Zhen 1

Ayumi Shibata is a Japanese artist.

I was interested in his material because in Japanese, kami means God or spirit, but it also means paper, and in Shintoism, paper is a sacred material. "Invisible spirits exist in various objects, events and places, as well as in our homes and bodies," says Shibata Ayumi.(Shibata, 2023)

The artist's ethereal landscapes depict a world where humans and natural forms coexist, and her work can be described as having a "yin and yang" element. Paper represents yin, and the way the work casts shadows relates to the yang of the invisible world. "Light represents spirit and life – how the sun rises and breathes life into the world.




Figure 12 Artist : Ayumi Shibata




Figure 14 Artist : Frida Kahlo






Figure 16 Artist : Lu Shengzhong

Collection and Analysis Data

1. Data Collection

Working to create a work that is a representation of the feelings of motherhood is conveyed from the experiences that were received when giving birth because the feelings of the transition from woman to motherhood were the primary inspiration for Create this way, including studying documents about motherhood, women in various social roles and roles at present, studying the culture of writing Chinese characters to express blessings, using Chinese paper cutting, studying materials for creativity, choosing bamboo. Come help create structures and details combined with the use of Chinese paper cutting methods and study works of art to find ways to develop the work to have meaning and value in aesthetics according to the principles of visual art.

In traditional Chinese culture, women's obligations and status and their relationship with flowers have unique expressions. At the same time, women's reproduction, and physical and psychological changes in the process have also attracted much attention. Society's understanding of the importance of motherhood and the study of installation art based on the mother-child proposition can lead to some profound conclusions. First, China's fertility policy has far-reaching

consequences, limiting families' reproductive choices and causing society to pay high attention to the status of mothers. Despite policies restricting family size, Chinese society's awareness of the importance of motherhood has not weakened but may have further strengthened the emphasis on maternal roles.

This social recognition of the importance of motherhood is also reflected in the art installation. 2. Data Analysis

2.2 Analysis of form symbols

Traditional Chinese paper-cutting has the meaning of good wishes. Traditional Chinese paper cutting is often used to celebrate festivals and important

occasions such as the Spring Festival, weddings, and birthdays. Paper-cut works often depict various auspicious patterns to pray for good fortune and good luck.

In Chinese folk paper-cut art, the "doll holding a bun" is one of the most traditional, exaggerated, straightforward, and festive images. Reproduction is its most obvious role. It is the ruins of a matrilineal totem civilization that worshiped female fertility. I did a thorough analysis of the bun doll paper cutout symbols. The cutouts of bun dolls can be divided into two categories: images of a little boy and a young girl. Two components of a girl's appearance are a bun or braid, a double bird (also commonly known as an inverted chicken), a flower crown, and a flower vine. Men, bun dolls sport beards, long braids, or both. In my work, I incorporate a sense of self-awareness while retaining the original meaning of the bun doll in my childhood. No one can replace this special and unbreakable bond.

The symbol of the inner and outer shape created by imagining the structure of the mother and child is represented by a strong structure made from the weave of bamboo strands that wraps and protects the small internal structure, representing the mother protecting her child and providing space. A safe place under an arm or embrace is also imagined as a structure in the work. The use of writing Chinese ink to wish blessings on folded Chinese paper with scrolls of letters placed on the piece represents the meaning of the connection from Mother to child with words and language that are only auspicious is a blessing from mother to child.

2.3 Analysis of Techniques

Analyze traditional Chinese crafts such as bamboo weaving, paper-cutting, and calligraphy are often used in creative and practical crafts. My conclusion after learning techniques such as bamboo weaving and paper-cutting, as well as Chinese calligraphy: Paper-cutting is an artistic process of cutting paper into various patterns and forms. It has a long and glorious history that can be traced back to China. Because of its basic lines, exquisite shape, and a strong sense of space, it is often used for decoration, gifts, window decorations, and other functions.

Bamboo weaving is a method of making textiles from bamboo. Bamboo weaving can be made into various forms and buildings. Bamboo weaving is characterized by its natural material, environmental protection, solid structure, and strong adaptability. It can be processed through weaving, bundling, cutting and other processes.

Brush calligraphy is a unique traditional art in China. Throughout the ages, Chinese characters were created by the working people. They began to express words in the form of pictures. After thousands of years of development, they evolved into today's characters. In ancient times, writing with brushes was used for a long time, and then came into being. calligraphy.

Chinese traditional handicrafts have unique beauty and long history, which better reflects my theme. The blessings written in calligraphy can depict the close relationship between mother and child, and the paper-cut patterns can express the sense of security and protection the child feels in the mother's arms. When used as a weaving material, bamboo's elasticity and plasticity can be used to produce forms and structures that represent maternal tenderness.

Process of Creation

Sketches/ Model

This work is made of bamboo, and the outer circle symbolizes the tolerance and asylum of the mother from field data. Influential documents and artists Designed with the imagination and experience of motherhood; sketch work begins with a pencil drawing to find a clear way to work. From the shape of the mother and the activities she did with her child, the design was reduced to a few details, showing only semi-abstract structures and shapes. By relying on natural shapes and geometric shapes. The lines and direction of the lines on which the sketch is drawn. In the process of creating a sketch, use the drawing tools in the program procreate, A structural drawing shows internal and external details with lines. Overlap to form a structured image with clear boundaries of shape, volume, and detail.




Figure 17 Sketch 1




Figure 18 Sketch 2




Figure 19 Sketch 3




Figure 20 Sketch 4

2. Material and Equipment

First of all, choose the delicate bamboo strip of the material to dye some bamboo strips in the preparation of red dyes. Using the contrast between the nature of the bamboo and the red bamboo. Use acrylic paint to dye bamboo instead of spray paint, making the paint stick to the wood surface more smoothly. it cleverly shows the mother's strong inner world. The image of scissors with a conjoined caught doll is cut, and the mother's heart is full of tenderness.

3. Step of Creation

In small shapes woven with bamboo into a structure resembling a child's figure, stick paper on the shape painted with red paint, after which paper with white shapes is attached. 


Figure 22 Work in step 1

Pre-Thesis Creative Work

1. Pre-Thesis work 1

1.1 Idea/ Concept: The phrase is based on an old Chinese proverb that reads, "Women are naturally weak, but as mothers, they are powerful. It implies that while women are often weak, having children makes them stronger. However, I want to use my art to demonstrate the varied perspectives on fertility from a mother's standpoint.

1.2 Form: This work creates a semi-abstract shape, imagining the mother's figure and interior shape, showing the life full of abundance hidden under the skirt of the mother's maternity dress and enveloped by the external structure. The red bamboo weave is thin and allows the internal structure to be clearly visible.

1.3 Meaning: It displays the powerful side of mothers, shielding children like a hood, and exhibiting the cherish and worship of life fostered, which is an expression of tolerance and love. It is similar to how new life is nursed in the mother's body. We will investigate the significant changes in women's breasts after giving birth and nursing, providing warmth to the infants, in the following project based on the teacher's ideas.




Figure 27 Pre-Thesis Work 1

As a flower with rich symbolic meaning, the peony is regarded as a symbol of auspiciousness and echoes a mother's best wishes for her child. Through the use of peony petal shapes and bamboo weaving techniques, the work cleverly shows the warm and intimate relationship between mother and child, maternal love. In order to strengthen the emotional connection between mother and child, I chose to use a brush to write my blessings and thoughts for the child on rice paper, and I designed the words in the form of an infinite loop. This design not only highlights the beauty and vitality of the blooming camellia but also symbolizes the eternal and infinite love of a mother. 


Figure 34 Thesis Work 4






Recommendation
